



**Directions to St. Luke's North
From Route 33 via Route 22**

Take Route 33 to Route 22 West and travel approximately five miles to the Route 512 exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp and proceed through two stop lights. At the third stop light, turn right onto Brodhead Road. Make the first right into the parking lot. St. Luke's North will be directly in front of you.

From the North/Lehighton/Palmerton Areas

Take Route 209 or Route 443 East to Route 248 East. Travel approximately 19 miles to Bath. In Bath, turn right onto Route 512 South. Continue on Route 512 South for 3.5 miles to the light at Brodhead Road in Bethlehem. Turn left onto Brodhead Road. Make the first right into the parking lot. St. Luke's North will be directly in front of you.

From the West/Bethlehem Areas

Take Route 378 North to Route 22 East and proceed to the Route 512 North exit. Turn right at the end of the exit ramp and proceed through three stop lights. At the fourth stop light, turn right onto Brodhead Road. Make the first right into the parking lot. St. Luke's North will be directly in front of you.

St. Luke's audiology services include a broad range of comprehensive hearing evaluations for newborns, infants, children, adolescents and adults. Our audiologists offer specialized testing for infants and children and those who are difficult to test.

Specialized diagnostic evaluations include:

- Electronystagmography (ENG) for dizziness
- Brainstem Auditory Evoked Response (BAER) for neurology and hearing
- Otoacoustic Emissions (OAE) for hearing and other procedures

St. Luke's offers evaluations, dispensing and repair of a full range of hearing instruments, including numerous styles, sizes and digital technology from leading hearing aid manufacturers.

Hours: 8 am – 4:30 pm Monday through Friday. Evening hours are available on Monday. Appointments are required.

What is an audiologist?

An audiologist holds a master's degree or certification from an accredited university and has received specialized training in the prevention, identification and non-medical treatment of hearing disorders. Audiologists are required to complete a full-time internship and to pass a national competency examination by the American Speech Language and Hearing Association for Certification.

How does an audiologist differ from a hearing aid dispenser?

With a graduate-level education and professional certificate and license, an audiologist is the most qualified professional to perform hearing tests, refer patients for medical treatment and provide rehabilitation services such as hearing instruments.

Note: Ear physicians are NOT available at St. Luke's North for medical services such as wax removal.
